OBJECTIVES:

- Present an overview of the foundations of orchestral conducting and illustrate the professional path of a conductor.
- Inspire talented musicians of high school age and above (i.e. pre-college and college students, music educators, youth orchestra conductors, young professional conductors, etc.) to learn and explore the art of conducting and the duties of a professional conductor.
- Develop basic knowledge and guidance of score study, conducting techniques, overall musicianship, and leadership.

ELIGIBILITY:

Participants of all levels are welcome to apply (no previous knowledge or experience is required for application). Participants may be active or auditors. Twenty active participants will be accepted for the workshop. Active participants will have no less than 60 minutes podium time. Active participants will be divided into three levels: beginners, music educators, and advanced.

- **Beginners:** Participants in this category should be high school students and college students with or without conducting experience. Basic requirements are a general sense of musicality and the ability to read at least two clefs.
- Music Educators: Participants in this category should be currently studying toward a music education degree, graduates with a music education degree, or current professional music educators.
- **Advanced:** Participants in the advanced category should be conductors who are at the early stages of the orchestra conducting profession.

STRUCTURE:

This six full-day, intensive workshop will be taught and directed by Miguel Harth-Bedoya with further support of his assistants.

The program will present a balance between theory and practice, consisting of both inclassroom seminars and lab-oriented orchestra and ensemble sessions. Participants (excludes auditors) will be chosen for individual podium time based on their overall preparation of the repertoire. Participants are expected to be able to read all the notes in the score, as well as know the dynamics and articulation markings, in order to conduct a piece. Time assigned at the podium will be at the discretion of the instructor, but will be no less than 60 minutes per participant. All podium sessions will be videotaped for review during the workshop, and will be for the participants to keep and use as needed with prior approval of Miguel Harth-Bedoya.
